Positive Behaviour Support (PBS)

Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) is a person centred framework for providing long term support to people with a learning disability, and / or autism, including those with mental health conditions who have, or may be at risk of developing, behaviours that challenge. It is a blend of person centred values and behavioural science and uses evidence to inform decision-making.

PBS approaches are based on a set of overarching values. These values include the commitment to providing support that promotes inclusion, choice, participation and equality of opportunity.

The overall aim of PBS is to improve the quality of a person's life and that of the people around them. This includes children, young people and adults as well as older people.

PBS provides the right support for a person, their family and friends to help people lead a meaningful life and learn new skills with unnecessary restrictions. It is not simply about getting rid of problematic behaviour. With the right support at the right time, the likelihood of behaviour that challenges is reduced.

Quality of Life

Here at William Henry Smith School, we believe that all our children and their families deserve a good Quality of Life (QoL) regardless of their experiences prior to joining our school.

The QoL framework we use is based on key QoL principles and which incorporates the three main QoL domains of Social Participation, Well-being and Independence.

The QoL approach is based on three data collection points within the academic year, both for students and for their families.

As a starting point, we use termly QoL surveys to capture those highly personal issues that individual students want to tell us about which are having an impact on their QoL. We use this information to set targets linking QoL issues to EHCP outcomes in order to give them more personal relevance and to guide how we support them on an individual basis. We also analyse the responses from the collective student group to inform how we work at a whole school level.

We also feel that it is essential to work with the students' families in a similar way. So, we ask them to complete a family QoL survey at the same time as their sons. This enables us to capture the concerns that each individual family has as a result of their son's issues.

Keyworkers use this information to follow up on issues within the scope of their role, to pass on information to other members of staff, to seek advice from specialists on the school team, and to contribute to the review of the individual student's EHCP outcomes. We also analyse the collective family responses and use this to plan and deliver training sessions for families and to develop additional services to address their concerns.





Evacuation, Invacuation and Lockdown



Evacuation

This is where there is a safety risk within the building or buildings and they need to be evacuated. The main reason for this would be a Fire Alarm. However, in serious situations, this could be a bomb threat or suspicious mail received.

All staff and students evacuate the building and assemble in the designated safe areas, as per the evacuation policy. The assembly point may differ depending on the reason for evacuation as may the siren / signal.



Invacuation

This is where there is a safety risk or risk to health from outside the building, such as a chemical leak or something in the atmosphere.

The warning siren for an invacuation procedure is the sound of ascending chimes, which will be played over the external sound system. Staff and Students and, in severe cases, members of the public would remain on site, inside with the doors and windows closed until the authorities have given the all clear that it is safe to go outside.

This is where there is an unexpected serious immediate threat to staff and students on site from an external person or persons.

Staff and students would be alerted to this threat via a telephone call explaining, where possible, the situation and if not, in more serious situations, using the code phrase "Bill Smith is on Site". This message should be passed round via telephone to the rest of the school.

Staff and students should remain where they are and lock all doors and windows, blocking access where possible. In the majority of cases, students don't need to be made aware of the situation and things should carry on as normal within "Lockdown" so as not to cause distress or anxiety to students. However, in more serious situations and if it has been necessary to use the above code phrase, you should ensure all students and staff sit on the floor against solid walls away from glass, turn off lights, close blinds or curtains, switch mobile phones on to silent and remain quiet and where you are until you have received notification via the code phrase that "Bill Smith has left Site".


